Readings for 2nd Sunday of the Year (pp. 533-534): Today, after the festive Christmas season, we return to the Church's liturgical 'Ordinary Time', in which the Gospel readings invite us to accompany Jesus in his public ministry. A common theme in today's Bible readings is that of *vocation*. Isaiah (1st reading) prophesies a mysterious "suffering servant" who will not only recall Israel to its vocation as God's people, but, as a "light to the nations", will extend that call to salvation "to the ends of the earth". In St. John's Gospel reading for today, we see how Jesus – when still an unknown figure – begins to fulfill that prophecy publicly as he is identified as the Son of God in his baptism at the Jordan. The 'apostle to the gentiles', St. Paul (2nd reading), stresses this same universal call to holiness – so much stressed at Vatican Council II – at the beginning of his first letter to the Greeks at Corinth.

Visit of Cardinal Burke to SMV: We were blessed yesterday morning by the visit of our former St. Louis Archbishop, His Eminence Raymond Leo Cardinal Burke, who offered Holy Mass at our high altar in the Traditional Latin Rite ('extraordinary form'). The Mass was sponsored by the St. Louis chapter of 'Juventutem', a Vatican-approved international apostolate for promoting the use of the old Latin liturgical rites among young adult Catholics. They provided fine singing and organ music at what was a memorable day for our church. The weather remained good and we had 145 attendees, including 20 priests, religious brothers and seminarians. In his homily for the Feast of St. Hilary, who in the 4th century defended the orthodox Catholic faith at a time of crisis in the Church, Cardinal Burke stressed his relevance for our own time. Please pray for this distinguished Prince of the Church, who has been emerging as one of the world's leading upholders of orthodox Catholic faith and morals at a time of increasing confusion and division within the Catholic Church, and hostility toward her from outside.
